Benedict Tatti was born in New York City in 1917. He received his early art education at the Art Students League and studied both sculpture and painting with Hans Hoffman, Ossip Zadkine and William Zorach.

For several years he was retained as a designer for firms such as Loewy Snaith Associates, Newell & Lennen and J. Walter Thompson. Currently he is department head for sculpture at the High School of Art and Design. Since 1968 he has been experimenting with electronic images. In 1970 he was an artist-in-residence at the National Center for Experiments in Television, San Francisco, Calif. In 1972 he received a grant from the New York State Council Creative Arts Program for his work.
