1. <u>The challenge</u>:

The organisation of a five-day conference on new ideas in art and science to be held for specialists from several countries in the fields of art, science, philosophy and sociology. The objective of the meeting is to discuss some of the major directions in art and science today with practitioners in various fields, particularly those concerned with the fundamental transformations taking place in certain areas of knowledge and the effect of those changes on contemporary culture and society. ۲.

The event will be a cross between conference and workshop, encouraging the maximum exchange between all participants in an attempt to grasp the meaning of the changes and to propose cultural policy directions promoting their positive evolution. The conference will be held from 19 to 23 November 1996 in the Presidential Palace of Prague, under the auspices of President Václav Havel.

2. <u>The subjects</u>:

(i) Art and Science: Our two modes of experimentation, deriving an order from things observed, have proposed in the modern era a New Renaissance: science, by inventing a new space, and art, by prefiguring that space and making it habitable and part of the human experience.

(ii) Fractal Geometry & Chaos Theory: The mathematical and scientific discoveries confronting us today, the continuation of the century's scientific revolution, play an important part in the new description of space and spatial organisation being proposed, with profound consequences for society.

(iii) The New Technologies: The technical products of the 20th century's scientific revolution have become the tools of the cultural transformation implicit in that revolution, building and defining a new mental space for Western civilisation.

(iv) The socio-political and cultural implications: The reorganisation of society and culture is heavily influenced by the role of communication and the media, and their interface with artistic creativity defines a potentially new cultural dynamic, particularly important for all countries in Europe as changing political, economic and technological circumstances force countries to redefine their societies and the needs and responsibilities of the individual citizen.

3. <u>The programme</u>:

The three days of in-depth discussion will each have a certain number of presentations by specialists and practitioners in science, art and the social sciences, complemented by a discussion with the participants. Each presentation will be a brief point of introduction of a particular idea, opening the debate to all present. 491 24

Speakers will not be speakers in the traditional sense, but will rather outline a basic idea for the others, and, with help from the moderator, develop that idea, particularly in its relation to the other disciplines.

The third day of discussion will end with a round-table on possible actions to be taken and recommendations to be made to the Council of Europe for initiatives in the field. To guarantee that this new cultural space be truly European, recommendations should include ways to assure that it develops as such and that it expresses all that is important to evolving European culture, and at the same time be prepared to interact globally with those who are interested.

Important to the conclusion of the Conference is further encouragement of the interface and cooperation between art and science, the continuation of the dialogue begun and support to initiatives where that dialogue already exists, as an essential part of the research into the future of Western civilisation. Closing the gap that has existed for generations between the two should be an objective of the conference discussion and its aftermath as a means of injecting a new dynamism into the cultural development of the continent.

5. <u>Place</u>:

The Conference will be held in the Ballgame Hall of the Presidential Palace of Prague.

6. Participants:

Seventy specialists and practitioners in art, science and education, as participants, speakers or observers, concerned by the cultural and social transformations being discussed and capable of putting into action and disseminating the ideas proposed by the conference, plus eleven specialists and officials from the Council of Europe and three international journalists as reporters. Delegations from the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe and from the European Parliament.

7. Languages:

Czech, French and English with simultaneous translation.

8. <u>Multimedia</u>:

The Conference will be recorded in both audio and video, including the on-line connections, so that the material may be edited and organised subsequently for television transmission and as educational material to be distributed Europe-wide. A documentary on the event will be made by the Kratky film a.s.

The discussion will also be transmitted to distant sites, first the Museum of Modern Art in Prague, as well as other sites in cities in Europe and North America interested in the debate, the Mindship in Copenhagen and Columbia University in New York.
