Progress report on the six Tables of Brotherhood

Each of the six Tables has its idiosyncratic variation and regardless its outward appearance, the inner structure always follows a certain template.

The major Opto/Mechanical parts come or are to be selected from war surplus, a resource reasonably abundant in the Southwest. Although all necessary auxiliary systems are to be found or be inspired by the war environment, a major reconstructive procedure is needed to achieve this symbolic transformation.

Of the six Tables, number three was the first to be built. Completed in April of 1994, it has been shown at the following sites:

May: Federal Exhibition Hall in Bonn, Germany

Jun: Ars Electronica, Linz, Austria.

Jul: The Brno Fair, Brno, Czechie Aug: Manes Gallery, Prague, Czechie

Sep: Lace, Los Angeles, California Oct: The Polytechnic Institute, Brno, Czechie

Nov: V-2 Gallery, Rotterdam, Holland

It is slated for a showing in the Palace of Exhibitions in Rome, Italy in early 1995
